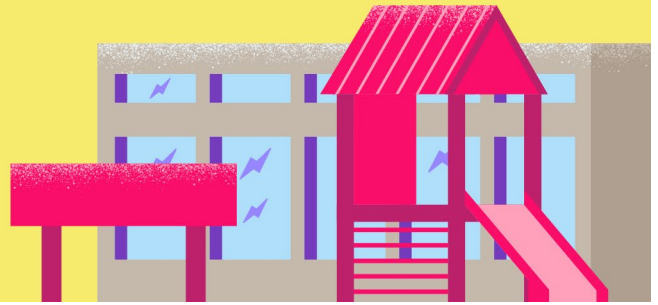


Power saving checklist for the classroom
